About the charity

Day One Trauma Support works alongside NHS clinicians, embedded as part of the team within Major Trauma Centres and across Trauma Networks, providing emotional and practical support to major trauma patients and their families.

Established in 2014 in Leeds, Day One Trauma Support has recently de-linked from Leeds Hospitals Charity (LHC), the official Hospitals Charity for Leeds Teaching Hospitals Trust. With LHC's full support, Day One Trauma Support is now an independent national charity.

Our ambition is to roll out our model of support to all UK Major Trauma Centres (MTCs) over the coming years and to develop the services we can offer people affected by major trauma outside of an MTC. With a proud history of supporting families across Yorkshire, and beyond, through our work within Leeds MTC we are now looking to build on our existing outreach work to ensure everyone affected by major trauma within the region are able to access Day One support when and where they need it.

About the role

Being part of a charity that makes a tangible difference to the lives of people affected by major physical trauma is both a responsibility and a huge privilege.

As part of an ambitious team, and as our first Outreach Worker, this role offers a unique opportunity to shape and develop our community programme, while supporting many families who simply will not get the support they need without us. You will work closely with families and patients of major trauma within community and NHS settings to identify and address issues and concerns caused by the impact of the major trauma.

The role is key to ensuring the roll out of the regional service feeds into and drives development of our national outreach service strategy, ensuring relevant data capture and recording. You will work with the Director of Service Delivery and

Development and the regional Caseworker to contribute to leadership of services by acting as lead in the role out of the Day One outreach programme within identified Major Trauma Networks across Yorkshire.

The post is initially offered as a three-year fixed term contract. However, funding is based on outcomes and the contract may be extended depending on the successful delivery of the outreach programme over this time.

You will report to the Director of Service Delivery and Development.
